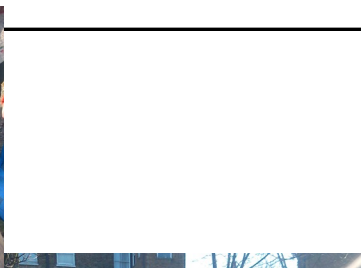

Ralph made swift work of repairing a collapsed fence with a shelving bracket, and it was all hands on deck to pick up bag loads of fallen twigs and small branches. As far as the produce goes, the broad beans that were sown in the autumn were looking good and there was a good harvest of very tasty (but rather diminutive) beetroots. Several rows of potatoes - early and late cropping—were chitted and sown, and a selection of salad crops were sown in the raised planter.
