We have had plenty of Jerusalem artichokes, but not a whole lot growing above ground! We have seen broad beans and onions making a strong appearance, plus leeks and chives. We planted tomatoes, garlic, lettuce and more chives. Various patches of potentially hazardous broken concrete hard standing were filled in expertly with quick-drying concrete, and 'green compost' was turned into two of the beds. Well done to the volunteers for all the hard work and for the over 200 working visits to the garden since this time last year!
